A TUTOR OF LONG-STANDING - COLIN McGUIRE

Joining U3A shortly after arriving in Toowoomba in 2004 became a stepping stone in helping Colin and Roswitha McGuire settle in and make new friends.

As Colin and Rose were going to Germany in 2005, Colin started learning "German". He also joined and played table tennis for many years when Terry Zropf managed the team.

It wasn't long before he resumed his profession of teaching, by using his skills tutoring U3A students in Apple Mac-Books and early editions of iPhones (think iPhone 3 released in 2008!).

When wife Rose gave him an iPad in 2010, he challenged himself to learn it and was tu-toring many "newbies" in the same boat within two months !!!

With the release of the iPad many seniors students were given these devices by Family to help them keep up to date with modern communication and be safe in a technological age. Collin's classes attracted large numbers with one of his biggest being 64 students.

With newer editions of the iPhones and the iPads drawing more students to his classes Colin began writing books, large and small, mostly electronic, on Apple skills and relevant Topics. To date produced approximately he's 49, and using Aptechnology, "dropped" ple

these into students' iPads and iPhones (saving on copious quantities of paper notes).

Information at your fingertips!

We've heard of "Sunday School Teachers", but Colin took this in a different direction when in 2014 he trialled an Advanced iPad Course on the Internet, with members from as far away as Glen Innis joining in. Following on from this he was invited, along with Rose, to teach on Saturdays and Sundays at Goondiwindi, and had a great time to boot. The happiest student during this time the dyslexic man was at Goondiwindi who learnt how to use SIRI to compile, send and receive/listen to messages and emails. A happy success story...

Back home, he often visited the homes of students, and students experiencing difficulties were welcomed to his home, learning to solve many iPad and iPhone problems with no charge.

For two years in conjunction with Law Week, and with support from Alan Langdon JP, Colin gave lectures to U3A members on "What are You Going to Leave Your Children, a subject about your "Digital Will/ Estate".

Over the years Colin has had many people assist and support him, such as Liz Kennedy (who is following in his footsteps), Peter Hatch, Fae Gatfield, John


We were also pleased to produce, research, write and edit the U3A History book which was a fantastic learning experience for all of us.





The Computer Skills class in Crows Nest continues to explore the many and varied facilities available in our on-line world.



menced at the University Capitole in Toulouse France in academic the year 1973/74. **Professor Pierre** Vellas, father of the current International President Professor Francois Vellas was the founder of U3A. It quickly spread around Europe and in 1976 crossed the chan-

nel to Cambridge, United Kingdom. It became evident that the French model, operating in mainstream universities would not be best suited to the UK and the focus changed to a community-based organization. The first Australian U3A opened in Melbourne in 1984. We now have 36 U3As in Queensland with some 22,000 members.
