"The group is very friendly and we have enjoyed some lovely Christmas breakup lunches at various members' homes."


"Some lasting friendships have been built over the years with many former players returning to the courts for a morning tea catch up."

- Person centred emergency preparedness (P-CEP) Workbook

- 3. POINT OF INFORMATION

Ideas for Consideration:

Google P-CEP Booklet and look up information online either through a computer or mobile device. And print for general information. This is an interactive APP (allows you to download and fill in form electronically and print) and needs online connection to look up relevant information for different areas.

Go to **DISASTER DASHBOARDS** as a point of factual updated information relating to weather, disasters, roadworks, electricity breakdowns etc. Note that each Regional Area Council has its own Dashboard information. So type in Area of interest i.e. Toowoomba, Warwick, Ipswich and then type Disaster Dashboard. Then click onto relevant council.

This information outlet is used by individual councils to update information in their relevant

shires as a point of truth as its updated regularly by various Emergency and Service Providers.

4.1 Dashboard provides the following sources of information in real time disaster concerns.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Ideas are linked into Fire Dept, Councils, Ergon etc, Department of Health.

The top of this dashboard has 4 major areas represented in different colours and covers in succinct mode the following:

4.2 Emergency Numbers,

Types of Emergencies; Weather, Fire, Flood, electricity outages, roadworks, and number of those listed. Map of area of interest.

- 4.3 The map viewed on this dashboard, has icons relevant to the areas where outages, weather events and roadworks are or have happened, and what is going on in that area and the type of help being given by allagencies and Government departments responding.
- 4.4 A map with icons representing roadworks, disaster spots, weather events, fire, flood and electrical outages in individual areas in Queensland. NB same Dashboard are available for most Regional Councils with the overall appearance similar but key information and links to point of truth information remains the same.
