PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcoming all Members to our 2024 U3A year! A special welcome to our 292 new Members.

Very encouraging to see about 1900 Seniors of the Toowoomba region appreciating what U3A has to offer and most importantly choosing to join classes/activity groups.

For some of us, Committee, Office Administrator, PPC Tutors and class groups at the PPC, it was a bit of a wild ride as we all started to adjust to the new Membership Management program. The most challenging, requiring many hours of extra work, were Members who chose not to use the new system. Here are some facts relating to payment of Membership for all and to class fees at the PPC for the months of January and February: 38% of the income received was paid securely online (Stripe) with Credit/ Debit Card. Everyone happy. You from the comfort of your own home and no further action needed by volunteers or Office. Thank You!

62% of income received was Cash 13%, EFTPOS 19%, Direct Transfer to bank 30%. Every one of these had to be individually entered into the new Membership Management system. HUGE job done by a few Committee members and Office Admin. You can choose to be helpful.

We would like to see at least 80% of our members paying the term class fees at the PPC securely online via their Debit/Credit Card (Stripe) to cut the workload of the volunteers and Trish. Better still 100%. We know that is a challenge. Access to the internet; about 10% of our members do not have an email address OR choose not to share it with U3A. Email will be our priority method of sharing information with all Members as we plan to engage more with Tutors and the full membership.

Progress has been made on the UniSQ / U3A Partnership Program. Following the return of the Survey sent to Tutors (thanks to those who replied) the possible subject areas sent to UniSQ are Archaeology, Graphic Arts/Visual Arts, Psychology, Astronomy, Anthropology, Modern History, Ecology (Inc._Environmental Studies/Wildlife Management/ Pollution Control). 'Pilot Scheme' to start mid-May. Thanks to Bruce Arthur, Liaison Officer, also to Tom Fusae and Carlo Bertoldi.

We have finally managed to retrieve our Office number and internet. Big thanks to Trish Barrett (Office Admin.) who was determined Telstra would return these services which were cut off when the Philharmonic changed their provider in January. Service was returned about 3rd week of March! Julie Grant (Treasurer) and Warren Dutton (Asset Manager) to be thanked also.

BADGES. Everyone needs to thank Trish for the huge number of hours she has spent in creating a Member badge for each and everyone of our nearly 1900 members. You will only be given one. That's it! Please wear to classes. Makes communication easier. These will be given to Tutors at PPC for distribution to their classes first. Distribution is a tricky business. Please be patient and appreciative.

Sending a special appreciation and thank you to all our Committee and other Team members, Office Admin. and Tutors for an enjoyable Term one. Well done! Good days ahead.

You will then have the option of clicking on the -

"Click here to pay for your class", link which will let you pay securely online by Credit/Debit card (Stripe). Have your Credit Card ready to enter the details.

This is the easiest and most direct way to pay and will cut the workload of our volunteers and Trish. We will appreciate your help in this.

Alternatively, you can go to the **Member Portal** on the **U3A website** and click on **Pay Owing** to pay for any outstanding fees. This may be more direct if you have a number of classes to pay for.

NEW GROUPS TO BE ENTERED INTO THE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM TERM 2

The classes that will be entered are those that do not require the Tutor to collect fees to pay for a venue. Eg. Walking Groups/Photography/home groups etc.

Classes will be accessible via the Member Portal. Members continuing in these classes from Term 1 will be entered into the system either during the last week of Term 1 or the first week of the break. You don't need to do anything.

CLASS ENROLMENT FOR TERM 2 (Not Membership)





Use this Portal *after* you become a Member to join a class. (see above)

The Portal needs you to "register" before you can access your details and or enrol in classes and securely pay online by way of Credit or Debit card.

To **register**, you need your email address used in your Membership records and a 6 digit Registration number which will be sent to your email address while you are online. Then you will need to create a 4 Digit PIN for future use on the device you are using.


>MEMBER PORTAL (NOT membership)

>enter your EMAIL ADDRESS (used for U3A membership) >tap or click on "CHECK EMAIL"

>window asks you to enter a 6 digit **REGISTRATION NUMBER** (for first time use on the device or Browser) or **4 digit PIN** number (when using the same device again). You will now be "registered" and you can follow the prompts to "join" a class.

(If after registering on one device and you wish to use another device or browser then you will need to "reregister" and get another 6 digit registration number via your email) then you will need to use the same 4 digit PIN).


